→ Jesus' brought fulfilment to Feast of First Fruits — He was resurrected on the Day of Feast of First

Fruits (Lev. 23:11; 1 Cor. 15:20-23).

Disciples rested during the 2 Sabbath days.
They only went back to tomb on Sunday.
